Many thanks to all those who attended the presentation in Millington Village Hall on Friday 3rd May by Chloe Cargill on behalf of the Kaikoura Ocean Research Institute (KORI), New Zealand.

Attendees filled the hall for a lively discussion about the natural history, ecology and conservation of the smallest penguin in the world, and its close relative, the white-flippered penguin.

An astounding £75 was raised through generous donations, which has been passed directly to the charity in order to further habitat improvement works, community engagement projects and ongoing scientific research.

To say 'Thank-You!' to residents for their support, KORI has named the first hatched little blue penguin chick of the 2019-2020 season Millington!
