## Dog fouling on the increase

Regrettably, the perennial problem of dog poop is upon us once more. Increased amounts of poop, particularly around Millington village centre, have been noted, including one 'anonymous' owner who persists in regularly kicking their doggie's doings into the road for other walkers to tread in and cyclists to ride over! Such behaviour is offensive to us all; your Parish Council supports East Riding of Yorkshire Council's (ERYC) Anti Dog-Fouling Campaign and if you're spotted leaving your dog's leavings, ERYC will prosecute.

Increased amounts of poop could occur as a result of more walkers visiting our area and while we of course welcome visitors, dog fouling is most unwelcome. To help, your Parish Council has invested in a waste bin which is now in use at the car parking area near the church in Millington. We'll also be discussing a spring 'colour spraying campaign' to help bring this dirty habit to the attention of all.

## Offroader causes damage to SSSI

Will the owner of a red Land Rover Discovery, registration number N335 JKX, please step forward! This vehicle was discovered in late January buried up to its front bumper in mud in the area of land immediately opposite the entrance to Millington Woods.

Not all parishioners or visitors to our area may be aware that the land at Millington Woods and in Millington Pastures is a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) and therefore protected by law. In fact, it's a criminal offence to intentionally or recklessly damage or disturb SSSIs.

The vehicle has been reported to the local police; here's hoping they'll pay a visit to this irresponsible driver. In the meantime, you can support your Parish Council in its efforts to protect the local environment by reporting any other drivers you see who think it clever to 'take the scenic route' and carve up our precious wildlife habitats

## Fruit & veg home delivery

If you're self-isolating, or don't want to go shopping, Brown's Greengrocers in Pocklington will deliver fruit & veg to your doorstep in Millington. (You don't have to be a self-isolator!)

You'll need to pay cash on delivery, or you can phone Brown's on 01759 307 134 and pay by card for 1 or more weeks in advance.

To join the scheme, you need to collect a form from St. Margaret's Church, Millington (open daily 10am – 4pm) and post it to Joy and Mike Hadley at Arundel House (opposite the Gait Inn).

It may be difficult to guarantee exact items but you can indicate on the form the type of produce you require weekly and how much you'd like to spend (to keep it manageable; this needs to be the same each week).

If you wish to cancel an order, or if there's any problem with the items you receive, just phone Brown's direct.
